MINUTES FROM THE LAST GENERAL MEETING, MAY 4, 2018

The meeting was called to order by Jenny Given, President at 1:15 PM.

Jenny asked Carol Lehmann, Membership Chair, to introduce our guests at today's meeting. Carol introduced Roseanne Kramer, Mary Pollicano, and Pilar Segura who are attending their first meeting. She also introduced Chantal Cannon and Pat Hanley who are attending their second meeting. Carol then told the club that Nancy Ricca had been voted by the Board to be an active member and she gave Nancy a welcome gift.

President's Report: Jenny reminded club members to fill out the surveys from last month. She said she had gotten back 12 so far, and hoped more would be returned. Anyone wanting another copy of the survey can pick one up at the back table. Jenny said these surveys will be very helpful in planning for next year's programs and activities. Jenny also reminded club members that they can order a box lunch for themselves for the day of the tour. The box lunch costs \$14, there are 3 choices of sandwich, and they can be picked up the day of the tour at Catchy from 11 - 2 PM. Orders have to be placed before 5/24.

First Vice President's Report: Sharon Gilsenan reported that the nominating committee had completed its work and all positions had been filled with the exception of a publicity chair and someone to help Anthea Luter with the Stable Garden. The slate has been e-mailed to everyone in the club and will be voted on at the June meeting.

Sharon has half-price tickets for the Garden Conservancy Open Days if anyone wants to purchase them.

Sharon reminded everyone that National Pollinators Week is June 18 - June 25. Ridgewood has been named a "bee city". The garden club will be hosting an event at BookEnds on Saturday, June 23rd at 11. Rick Mikula will be teaching kids how to make a bee habitat out of items bought from the Dollar Store. This event caps off the Pollinators Week.

Treasurer's Report: Eileen Dowling reminded everyone that they need to give her a check for \$32 for the June 8 luncheon at the Ho-Ho-Kus Inn. Jenny commented that the luncheon was a week later than usual because of the garden tour. The garden tour is on Sunday June 3rd. The June board meeting is on Wednesday, June 6th at Sharon Gilsenan's home, and the luncheon is on June 8.

Garden Tour: Maria Gilosa reported that she was working on getting us as much free publicity as she possibly could. We were part of an article on May 2nd in the Homescape section of the Record featuring 3

garden tours. Maria has placed a notice of the tour with the Master Gardeners of Bergen County web site, and on the Ridgewood Patch. The on-line magazine Dig-it, is also mentioning the garden tour. We will be sending out an e-mail blast to everyone on our e-mail list as well as to the District 1 President. All of this is at no cost to us. The tri-fold mailing was sent out on April 23rd and the tickets are now available in stores. The sketches in the ticket that illustrate each garden write-up were done by Liz O'Leary and the original sketches will be matted and framed and given to the homeowners as a thank you gift.

On Friday June 1st we have arranged to have a cocktail party at Lisa Betancourt's home. The homeowners, sponsors, artists, and committee members are invited. The committee members will bring wine and appetizers.

The potting shed is still in need of more items. Things can be dropped off at Debbie Engel's home or brought to the Stable Friday afternoon after 2 PM, when the potting shed committee will be pricing and setting up. Tools, furniture, pots, and other garden items are needed.

Barb Masarky and Lisa Betancourt are putting together the docent shifts. Anyone who knows they cannot work a certain time should let Barb know. They will do the best they can to accommodate everyone. Any member who cannot work on the day of the tour must get a substitute to docent for her. The tour can use one or two more small canopy tents in case of rain.

Green Kids: Leslie Kolvek reported that the kids made bamboo wind chimes to give to their mothers for Mothers' Day. There are two more sessions. Next week they will discuss water conservation and see the new rain barrel bought for the Stable Garden, and at the final session they will release their butterflies. The kids also spent time in the garden weeding the path of the invasive ground cover that is growing there.

Public Gardens:

Stable Garden: Leslie Kolvek described how over-run the Stable garden is with an invasive ground cover. It is not possible to spray it with a herbicide as the area is a certified natural habitat, so the only way to remove it is to dig it up, a very time consuming and difficult task. As the Stable garden will be on the garden tour Leslie wants to get as much of the ground cover up as possible. What is left in the garden will be the topic of an educational sign describing invasive and non-native species. On May 18 Leslie wants as many members as possible to come to the Stable and work on weeding. She has a sign-up sheet.

Library Garden - Judy Collins said they would have a clean-up day scheduled soon and would send an e-mail to everyone.

Van Neste - All the bulbs are in full bloom now and the park looks beautiful. They will not be scheduling a clean-up day until the bulbs begin to die back. They will send an e-mail. Jenny commented that we had participated in the Daffodil Festival at Van Neste on Sunday April 22 and the park looked wonderful. We partnered with Goffle Brook Farm and gave out seeds and the tri-fold invitation to the garden tour. It was a very successful festival.

Habernickel - Irene de Castro said the Parks Dept has not cleaned up any of the large branches and limbs that came down in the March snowstorms and until they do we will not be working in those areas. Irene has bought vinca to plant around the front stone pillars and will send out an e-mail for a planting day.

Special Projects: Eleanor Collins told the members that all the special projects for the year are completed.

Website: The up-dated website is coming along. And PayPal is now available to buy garden tour tickets and order box lunches for the garden tour.

Trips: Betty Wiest has a trip set for Boston for May 16-18.

Yearbook: The deadline to get information into the Yearbook is July 15.
