To raise awareness of the role of pollinators, the week of June 18th has been designated as National Pollinator Week. Many organizations, such as The Conservancy for Ridgewood Public Lands, HealthBarn, the Bergen-Passaic Native Plant Society, and the Ridgewood Public Library, have partnered to present a week of events. The Women Gardeners of Ridgewood is sponsoring noted guest speaker, Rick Mikula, "The Butterfly Guy" on Saturday, June 23rd, at 11 a.m. at Bookends. Rick is a Habitat Consultant for numerous museums, zoos, aviaries, universities, and parks, such as Dolly Parton's Butterfly Emporium at Dollywood and the Hershey Gardens Butterfly House. Rick has also been featured on Animal Planet and the Discovery Channel, as well as in newspapers, magazines and on the radio. Rick's presentation will be delightful for the whole family. MINUTES FROM THE LAST GENERAL MEETING - APRIL 6

The meeting was called to order at 12:40 by Jenny Given, President.

President's Report: Jenny Given thanked the hostesses for a wonderful luncheon and the beautiful floral arrangements. Jenny let the membership know that Dianna Unver's husband had had a double lung transplant in Philadelphia and was doing well. Dianna will be there for a few weeks while he recovers. Janel Clinch thanked the membership for their support following the death of her husband.

Membership: Carol Lehmann let the club know that we had 4 guests at today's meeting. Janel Clinch introduced her guest, Nancy Ricca. This is Nancy's second meeting. Eileen Dowling introduced her guest, Chantal Cannon; Eleanor Collins introduced her guest, Pat Hanley, and Carol introduced Megan DeVoe who came to us through our web site.

Treasurer's Report: Eileen Dowling reported that our balance on March 1, 2018 was \$13,401.58 and our balance on April 1, 2018 was \$14,993.63. We had income from dues and from Pinot's Palette from our workshop there.

Daffodil Festival: Jenny let the club know that we would be partnering with Goffle Brook Farm at the Daffodil Festival on Sunday, April 22nd. Goffle Brook Farm has a table and they will supply small plants and we will supply the volunteers at the table. Jenny needs about 6 volunteers. She passed around a sign-up sheet.

Programs: Jenny told the club that she and Sharon had created a survey that she would like all club members to fill our and return to her or Sharon. The survey asks for information regarding the kinds of programs members have enjoyed and found worthwhile, as well as asking the membership for their feelings and ideas about other projects and activities the club is currently sponsoring. Jenny said the survey will be very helpful going forward as we plan for next year.

Public Gardens: All the gardens are still dormant and waiting for warmer weather. Judy Collins reported that she had found out that the grant that had been written for the Library garden to the National Garden

Club had been turned down. But Judy has been contacted by the Garden Club of NJ who suggested that Judy apply for a "civic award" from the GCNJ for the Library garden. Judy has done that. The award will be \$50.

Garden Tour: Maria Gilosa asked club members to sign up to help the James Rose House with their spring cleanup. It will be on Saturday and Sunday, April 28 and 29. The James Rose House is on the garden tour. Maria has order forms from the Ho-Ho-Kus garden club for their annual spring plant sale. The next full garden tour committee meeting is on Tuesday, April 24 at 10 AM at the Stable. The ticket is almost ready to go to the printer. Samara Saunders and Leigh Saltiel are working to get PayPal set up so that both tickets and the box lunch can be ordered and paid for with one visit to the PayPal site. The tri-fold mailing will be going out on April 23rd. If anyone has names and addresses that they would like included in the mailing they should e-mail Maria. Club members can order a box lunch for themselves for the day of the tour. Maria will have a sign-up sheet at the next meeting. Maria has "save-the-date" cards for anyone who wants some. Lisa Betancourt reminded everyone in the club that they must serve as a docent for at least one shift with the exception of the hospitality committee and the potting shed committee. If a club member knows that she will not be able to serve as a docent she must get a sub for herself. Lisa also said that members should contact Barbara Masarky if they want to serve on a particular shift. She will try and meet all requests.

Executive Vice President's Report: Sharon Gilsenan thanked everyone who has agreed to serve on the Board next year. She said we still have 3 openings. We need a publicity chair, a third person for the program committee, and someone for the Stable garden. Sharon said planning is going ahead for National Pollinators Week in June. We will be hosting Rick Makula on June 23rd.

Green Kids: Anthea Luter reported that the first session of the spring program was held yesterday, April 5. There are 6 or 7 kids registered and they painted rocks to look like bugs and leaves. Leslie Kolvek will take the rocks home and shellac them so the kids can put them in their gardens. The kids also spent time in the Stable garden. There are 5 more sessions. The birdhouses the kids made last fall have been hung in the trees. The green kids program received a wonderful letter from an 8th grader who had been a participant in the past and she asked to become a volunteer with the group this spring. She was with the group yesterday.

Trips: Betty Wiest let the membership know that she is planning a spring trip to the "Hidden Gardens of Beacon Hill" from May 16-May 18. Betty has plans for a number of activities. An e-mail was sent to everyone outlining the extent of the trip and its approximate costs, so everyone should refer to that e-mail for details. Betty has 6 people signed up so far and needs to know by Monday April 9 who is planning to go so she can reserve a block of hotel rooms.

Scholarships: Joan Kokoska and Mandy Clark reported that we had only 2 applicants this year, and neither was qualified to receive an award, and so we will not be giving out any grants this year.

Potting Shed: Debbie Engel, Judy Collins, Janel Clinch and Jeannette Wiener are collecting items for the potting shed to be held during the garden tour. They are storing stuff now, so items can be delivered to them at any time.
